# Following Jesus 14, Principles of Kingdom Living #5: "There is no try" (Dos and Don'ts of Relationships in the Kingdom) Matthew 7:1-12

- I. Message "Principles of kingdom-living #5: There is no try
  - **a. DON'T: be judgy** (judgmental) what does this take? (2 things)
    - i. First, don't be critical other others
      - 1. "1 Judge not..."
        - a. Not talking about being undiscerning
        - b. Christians MUST be discerning
          - i. The church must judge between innocence and guilt as final step of discipline Matthew 18:17 "And if he shall neglect to hear them, tell it unto the church: but if he neglect to hear the church, let him be unto thee as an heathen man and a publican."
          - ii. The church must judge between truth and error Galatians 1:8 "But though we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel unto you than that which we have preached unto you, let him be accursed."
          - iii. The church must judge between dividers and uniters

             Romans 16:17 "Now I beseech you, brethren, mark
             them which cause divisions and offences contrary to
             the doctrine which ye have learned; and avoid them."
        - c. What IS he saying?
          - i. Don't be critical of others!
          - ii. Luke 18:9-14 "And he spake this parable unto certain which <u>trusted in themselves that they were</u> <u>righteous, and despised others</u>: 10 Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican..."
            - 1. God hates this human tendency:
            - 2. God hates self-righteous condemnation of others
            - 3. Not talking about discerning good/evil
            - 4. He's talking of despising other PEOPLE for their lack of "comparative righteousness"
      - 2. When you criticize others, you forget 2 REALLY important things:
        - a. **You forget who God is:** He is the final Judge and He has given the responsibility of final judgment to His Son, Jesus
          - i. "1 Judge not, that ye be not judged."

- ii. John 5:26-27 "For as the Father hath life in himself; so hath he given to the Son to have life in himself; 27 And hath given him authority to execute judgment..."
- iii. When I criticize and despise others, I forget this
  - 1. I put myself in the place of Jesus
  - 2. How presumptuous, even blasphemous!
- b. **Secondly, you forget who you are**: a big sinner
  - i. Rather than criticize/despise, deal with your own sin
  - ii. "3 And why beholdest thou the mote (sliver) that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye?"
  - iii. Romans 14:12-13 "So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God. 13 Let us not therefore judge one another any more:"
    - 1. We are so blind to our own faults
    - 2. We are so quick to judge and criticize others
    - 3. For some of us, this has become such a normal way of life, that we can't even see it
    - 4. It is our default, our M-O
      - a. This is the problem with sin-planks
      - b. They blind us to our sin-plank!
  - iv. We are forgetting who God is and we are forgetting who we are: just big sinners, saved by big grace, standing before a holy God Who will judge all against the standard of a perfect Savior!
    - 1. 1 Corinthians 11:28 "But let a man examine himself..."
    - 2. 1 John 1:10 "If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us."
    - 3. Luke 16:14-15 "And he said unto [the Pharisees], Ye are they which justify yourselves before men; but God knoweth your hearts: for that which is **highly esteemed among men is** abomination in the sight of God."
- ii. Second, confront error at the right time and in the right way
  - 1. Help others with their sin
    - a. "5... first cast out the beam out of thine own eye; and then shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out of thy brother's eve."
    - b. Don't use this command as an excuse to refuse confrontation of sin (in us, then others)

- c. Psalm 51:13 "<u>Then</u> will I teach transgressors thy ways;and sinners shall be converted unto thee."
- 2. Be discerning of doctrinal error
  - a. "6 Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn again and rend you."
  - b. You would never give something sacred to a dog or throw it into the pig pen to be trampled
    - i. That would be at the least disrespectful
    - ii. Perhaps even blasphemous
    - iii. But the context here is discernment
    - iv. Don't let what is holy (doctrine) be dirtied and desecrated by spiritual dogs or unclean pigs, scavengers, mongrels, wolves in sheep's clothing
    - v. Matthew 7:15 "Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves."

### 3. This is what love (the hallmark characteristic) doesn't do

- a. It does not criticize and condemn judgmentally
- b. But it ALSO does not allow error to pervade and ruin the church
- c. It does not
  - i. Look for sin in everyone else
  - ii. But is also does not allow sin go undealt with

#### b. DO: be selfless

- i. "12 Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets."
- ii. V.12 is the key of the whole passage known as the Golden Rule
  - 1. Do to others WHAT YOU WISH they would do for you
    - a. 2 Timothy 3:2-4 "For men shall be lovers of their own selves..."
    - b. Philippians 2:21 "For all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's."
      - i. People without Jesus love themselves
      - ii. They accuse, fight, envy, hate, seek their own benefit

## iii. Jesus says, MY subjects are different!

- 1. Love God, Love others...Vertical, horizontal
- 2. Jesus is driving them to a conclusion: we are unworthy of the kingdom
- 3. Those that understand that
- 4. Are ready for the gospel!
- 2. What about v.7-11?
  - a. Look at the start of v.12 for a moment

- b. "Therefore"
- c. Based on v.7-11, do the Golden Rule
- d. What truth is there for us to base this radical love on?
  - i. I can give up what I think I need, because God has promised to supply my needs!
  - ii. 7 Ask and receive
  - iii. Seek and find
  - iv. Knock and enter
  - v. 11...how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him?
  - vi. Trust your good Father to provide good gifts

#### II. Conclusion

- i. Conclusion #1 Is your default mode judgmentalism?
  - 1. Critical of others and Christians in particular?
  - 2. Some of us are **really stuck** in this mode
  - 3. Nobody does things the way YOU think they should
  - 4. Confess that as sin and work on your own "beams" instead!
- ii. Conclusion #2 Are you actually living the Golden Rule?
  - 1. Do you afford others patience you want them to have with you?
  - 2. Do you give others the benefit of the doubt you want to have?
  - 3. Do you empathize with people you don't particularly LIKE?
  - 4. Do you sacrifice your hard-earned resources for others' benefit?
    - a. This is the Golden Rule
    - b. And Jesus expects this of His subjects!
