## Following Jesus 15, Principles of Kingdom Living #6: Stay on the Straight and Narrow Matthew 7:13-29

- I. Message "Principles of kingdom-living #6: Stay on the straight and narrow
  - a. The popular path leads to destruction
    - i. Popular: Widely liked or appreciated
      - 1. True axiom of Christian living: what is widely liked and appreciated is rarely Jesus' way
      - 2. Kingdom living is different! (usually 180 out of phase with world)
    - ii. "13 Enter ye in at the strait (narrow) gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: 14 Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it."
    - iii. What is Jesus saying?
      - 1. The path to true life is narrow and hard, few go that way
      - 2. The path to destruction is broad, most go that way
      - 3. Why would they do that? That seems foolish!
    - iv. The broad way is popular because the broad way is easy
      - 1. It's easy to be religious or irreligious
      - 2. Most people are one way or the another
      - 3. It's hard to humble yourself and put faith in Christ alone!
      - 4. Not all religious people are going to heaven
        - a. Proverbs 30:12 "There is a generation that are pure in their own eyes, and yet is not washed from their filthiness."
        - b. Romans 10:2-4 "For I bear them record that they have a zeal of God, but not according to knowledge. 3 For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God. 4 For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth."
      - 5. It is easy to SAY you are a Christian
        - a. It is easy to say you "believe in Jesus" or "believe in God"
        - b. But that does not mean that are you actually one of His!
        - c. James 2:19 "Thou believest that there is one God; thou doest well: the devils also believe, and tremble."
        - d. Do you have SAVING faith?
          - i. Saving faith triangle
          - ii. Understand, agree, trust (in Jesus only, exclusively)
    - v. The popular way (most liked and appreciated) is to have to DO something

- 1. This works good for organized religion do stuff we demand
- 2. But it doesn't work for God!
  - a. Gospel presentation, Niagara River (row-boat)
  - b. Most people hold tenaciously to other things (oars)
  - c. But they are headed to eternal destruction (falls)
  - d. They must put down their oars and grab the rope (Jesus)
  - e. You can't do both!
    - i. John 14:6 "Jesus only "Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me."
    - ii. That's pretty narrow
    - iii. Jesus only
    - iv. "When it comes to life-building, the popular way is seldom the best way!"
- b. Popular teachers (may) lead to decay
  - i. "15 Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. 16 Ye shall know them by their fruits."
  - ii. Sad reality: MOST people prefer false prophets
    - 1. They are the ones selling tickets to the broad way
    - 2. They are not inviting to reconcile with God through Jesus alone
    - 3. They are not preaching what Peter was preaching in Acts 4
    - 4. Acts 4:12 "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved."
    - 5. That's too narrow, and frankly it is not profitable
  - iii. How do you know? Check out the fruit of every "prophet" (v.16-20)
    - 1. Popular ways to evaluate leaders:
      - a. Degree, college, seminary, ability to speak
      - b. Good looks, size of church, size of TV audience
      - c. Did their book make the NYT best sellers list?
        - i. Nothing wrong with these things in themselves
        - ii. But these are the wrong credentials for leaders
        - iii. How about love God, love others, love the Word?
      - d. I mean, is Jesus actually making a difference in their life?
        - i. Are they displaying the fruit of the Spirit?
        - ii. Galatians 5:22-23 "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, 23 Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law."
        - iii. Good fruit (fruit of the Spirit in action)
          - 1. Leading others to follow Christ

- 2. Loving marriage
- 3. Effective parenting
- 4. Integrity with finances
- 5. Healthy relationships
- iv. Corrupt fruit
  - 1. Problems with women
  - 2. Problems with wealth
  - 3. Problems with worldliness
- e. Popular teachers often lead to decay
  - i. In their own life
  - ii. Then in the lives of those that follow them!
  - iii. Remember: "When it comes to life-building, the popular way is seldom the best way!"
- c. Popular profession of faith in Christ (may) lead to death
  - i. 21 Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven..."
    - 1. It's one thing to claim many "wonderful works"
    - 2. It's a whole different thing to know God personally!
    - 3. Jesus is describing the difference between sayers and doers
      - a. James 2:14 "What doth it profit, my brethren, though a man say he hath faith, and have not works? can faith save him?"
      - b. Works don't save
      - c. But saved people work! they bear fruit!
  - ii. What does Jesus want?
    - 1. The will of the Father
    - 2. John 6:29 "Jesus answered and said unto them, This is the work of God (will of the Father), that ye believe on him whom he hath sent."
    - 3. Luke 9:23 "And he said to them all, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me."
      - a. Popular profession of faith is not enough
      - b. It will lead to death
      - c. Remember: "When it comes to life-building, the popular way is seldom the best way!"
    - 4. Jesus really sums it up with His last point (an illustration)
- d. Popular life-building methods lead to disaster
  - i. "24 Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock"
  - ii. Jesus lays out 2 options building your life on sand or on the Rock
    - 1. Again, one is easy, common, natural. The other is HARD (difficult)

- 2. Solid foundation vs. weak foundation
  - a. Luke 6:48 "...digged deep ... "
  - b. The houses look the same
  - c. Their ability to stand the test could not be more different
  - d. Only the life firmly grounded on Christ will stand
- 3. 1 Corinthians 3:11 "For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ."
- 4. Who does Jesus commend exactly?
  - a. "24...whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them"
    - i. Doing Jesus sayings vs. not doing Jesus sayings
    - ii. Interesting that both hear, only one does
- 5. Remember: "When it comes to life-building, the popular way is seldom the best way!"

  - i. Conclusion #1 Have you entered the narrow gate? Are you saved from your sin and on your way to Heaven?
  - ii. Conclusion #2 Are you analyzing the fruit of those you are following?
  - iii. Conclusion #3 How much authority does the King have in your life?Build your life on Him, the Rock, the true foundation
    - 1. "28 And it came to pass, when Jesus had ended these sayings, the people were astonished at his doctrine: 29 For he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes."
    - 2. We sometimes congratulate ourselves for "hearing" Jesus sayings
    - 3. There is no blessing for that
    - 4. Do you DO them?
      - a. This is where the blessing is at!
      - b. Review of SOM
        - i. Principle #1 Be Deliberately Different
        - ii. Principle #2 Don't believe everything you hear
        - iii. Principle #3 Secret is better than sensational
        - iv. Principle #4 Get a Grip
        - v. Principle #5 There is no try
        - vi. Principle #6 Stay on the Straight and Narrow
      - c. These are the commands the wise men build their lives on!
