Following Jesus God, Save Us Matthew 21:1-16

I. Message

- a. Jesus is THE Savior
 - i. Matthew 21:9 "...Hosanna to the Son of David"
 - ii. Hosanna
 - 1. Save us now! Comes from the first word of Psalm 118:25
 - 2. "Save now, I beseech thee, O LORD: O LORD, I beseech thee, send now prosperity. 26 Blessed be he that cometh in the name of the LORD:"
 - 3. This Psalm was used prominently in Passover worship, which happens to be the time Jesus is entering the city
 - a. It is a celebration of deliverance from Egypt
 - b. It points to the fact that God is a delivering God
 - c. Salvation is coming, just not the kind they were thinking
 - d. They did get one thing right
 - i. Jesus IS the Savior
 - ii. And worshipping for this is right!

b. Jesus is the rightful heir to the throne

- i. Who was this "Hosanna" directed to in Matthew 21?
 - 1. The Son of David
 - 2. A direct reference to the Messiah!
- ii. A physical descendant
 - 1. Christ (the Messiah) was the fulfillment of the prophecy of the seed of David (Nathan the prophet to David)
 - 2. 2 Samuel 7:12-13
 - 3. Matthew 1 and Luke 3 explain that both Mary (Jesus' mother) and Joseph (Jesus "adoptive" father) were descendants from David
 - a. One through David's son Nathan
 - b. And the other through David's son Solomon
 - c. Jesus is a descendant of David by adoption through Joseph and by blood through Mary.
 - d. So, He is a physical heir to the throne
 - e. Romans 1:3
 - f. But even more than the physical connection to David, the title "Son of David" was reserved for Messiah
 - i. The Jews knew this name was a reference to Messiah
 - ii. This is why the leaders were so furious
 - 1. This title for Jesus enraged the leaders because of what it meant

- 2. And it was right on the money!
- 3. Revelation 22:16

c. Jesus is the One sent from God

- i. Mark 11:10 "10...Hosanna in the highest."
- ii. This was an acknowledgement that salvation comes from on high
- iii. The crowd was saying, "You are our Savior from God in heaven!"
 - 1. Now they were thinking political salvation
 - a. The people wanted a military Messiah
 - b. They would have preferred that He come in on a white horse with a flashing sword in His hand
 - c. They would have preferred an impressive band of soldiers around Him.
 - d. But He did not come to make war with Rome, He came to make peace with God for men
 - i. Dealing with the sin problem first
 - ii. The ROOT issue of all other problems
 - iii. This is and has been God's priority
 - iv. Fixing the broken relationship with Him

d. Jesus is the cosmic peace-maker

- i. Luke 19:38 "38...peace in heaven, and glory in the highest.
- ii. Peace in heaven
 - 1. Interestingly the counterpoint of the angels' song in Luke 2
 - 2. "Peace to men on earth"
 - 3. Why should we praise God for peace in heaven?
 - a. There is peace in heaven now, because Jesus has taken away the wrath on sin
 - b. The enmity is gone
 - c. Ephesians 2:14-18

e. Jesus is God in flesh

- i. "God with us" as it says in Mathew 1
- ii. John 12:13 "Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh **in the name of the Lord**."
- iii. In the name of the Lord
 - 1. Jesus comes in the power and authority of God
 - 2. John 5:17-18; John 5:43-47; Philippians 2:5-6
 - a. Jesus was God, but did not hold on to His rights as God
 - b. Instead, He became a man to die for our sins
 - c. God as a man dying to fix the relationship between God and man!

- II. Conclusions what can we learn from this worship?
 - a. Have you been delivered by the Savior?
 - i. Is He Hosanna to you?
 - ii. Many people in the crowd had not PERSONALLY been delivered by Jesus
 - iii. In fact, they would turn on Him days later
 - iv. It is one thing to SAY "Hosanna", it is another thing to experience it!
 - v. Has God saved YOU? GOSPEL

b. Is He King of your life?

- i. David called his own descendant, Messiah, "Lord"
- ii. Is He Lord to you?
- iii. Luke 6:46
- iv. John 15:13-14
 - 1. Is your obedience to Jesus and His Word non-negotiable?
 - 2. If He says it, I do it, no questions

c. Have you adopted His mission?

- i. Or are you on your own mission?
 - 1. Maybe you've forgotten the mission
 - 2. Sometimes we do this in life
 - 3. Usually a result of a cluttered mind, too busy
- ii. Do you have different goals than God?
 - 1. Easy to think I am on mission with God
 - 2. And doing my own thing!
 - 3. John 4:31-38
 - a. Sharing the gospel of Jesus is God's priority
 - b. Seeing God change lives through the power of His Son

d. Are you celebrating your peace with God?

- i. This is really the pinnacle of human worship
- ii. Mercy and justice kissed each other on the cross
- iii. The cross is the bridge between sinful man and holy God
- iv. Psalm 85:10 "Mercy and truth are met together; righteousness and peace have kissed each other."
- v. Only God could do that and only in JESUS!
- vi. THAT is worth celebrating!

e. Worship Jesus correctly - for who He actually is!

- i. He is God in the flesh
- ii. Don't forget that your friend and Savior is also Creator God of Universe!
- iii. And He is to be worshipped in Spirit and in truth
 - 1. Revelation 5:8-10; Revelation 19:1
 - 2. Revelation 19:6-8
