Following Jesus Lay Down Your Life John 12:23-36

I. Message

- a. The principle: Jesus promised eternal profit for giving one's life to others
 - i. Jesus saw His own death as a precursor to glory
 - 1. "23 And Jesus answered them, saying, The hour is come, that the Son of man should be glorified."
 - 2. The moment (hour) had come
 - 3. The disciples were still in denial
 - 4. But Jesus was adamant
 - a. "I am about to die"
 - b. "And it will result in my glorification"
 - ii. He illustrates v.24:
 - 1. "24 Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except a [kernel] of wheat fall into the ground and die, it abides alone: but if it die, it brings forth much fruit."
 - 2. A kernel of wheat has to give up its life to leave a legacy
 - iii. Similarly
 - 1. "25 He that loves his life shall lose it; and he that hates his life in this world shall keep it unto life eternal."
 - 2. If a person selfishly lives their life for themselves, they lose
 - 3. At the end of their 70+/- years, they have themselves v.25
 - 4. BUT, if a person "hates" his life
 - a. Comparative word
 - b. In comparison to how much effort he spends on self
 - c. He lives his life for the eternal good of others (lays down His own life)
 - d. "He dies with a dirtiest towel wins"
 - e. That person keeps on living in others far after he/she is gone
 - f. He leaves an eternal legacy that far outlives himself

b. The pattern: Jesus was the greatest demonstration of giving one's life for others

- i. "32 And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me. 33 This he said, signifying what death he should die."
- ii. Jesus knew what was coming for Him
 - 1. He had been very strategic in His exposure to the religious leaders
 - 2. He knew they would be the ones to call for His execution
 - 3. He also knew the religious leaders couldn't legally execute Him
 - a. It would have to be the Romans

- b. And their favorite way of killing Jewish criminals: crucifixion on a cross
- c. "Lifting them up" John 3:14
- d. He was going to be crucified (the kernel that must die)
- e. To draw all men to Himself (to give life to billions)
- f. One dies and leaves an eternal legacy of fruit
- g. Jesus is the greatest demonstration of giving ones' life for the benefit of others (and eternal investment)

c. The practice: Believers in Jesus follow His example of giving one's life

- i. "35 Then Jesus said unto them, Yet a little while is the light with you. Walk while ye have the light, lest darkness come upon you: for he that walks in darkness knows not where he goes."
- ii. You've got an example for a little bit
- iii. Follow my example
- iv. When He referred to "the light", they knew He was referring to Himself
 - 1. John 8:12
 - 2. John 9:5
 - a. "36 While ye have light, believe in the light, that ye may be the children of light."
 - b. I'm not staying around forever
 - c. You have a limited window
 - i. So, start by believing in me
 - ii. Then follow my example (be the children of light)
