Following Jesus Washing Feet John 13:1-17

I. Message

- a. Demonstration: Jesus washed the disciples' feet
 - i. "4 He riseth from supper, and laid aside his garments; and took a towel, and girded himself. 5 After that he poureth water into a bason, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith he was girded."
 - ii. Foot washing in ancient times
 - 1. Sandals didn't do a whole lot to protect feet from dust and mud
 - 2. Feet were perpetually dirty before walkways were paved
 - 3. Often there would be a low-on-the-totem-pole servant there to do the job
 - a. No skill required
 - b. Just an attitude of humble service
 - iii. In this case, the disciples are in the house with Jesus
 - 1. They have arrived by there is no servant there to do the dirty work
 - 2. They sit down to a meal that is going to last several hours
 - 3. And they would be reclining around a low table
 - 4. A lot of heads were close to a lot of feet!
 - 5. Foot-washing for some guests would be a necessity, even among friends
 - a. Here are these selfish, self-absorbed men
 - b. Sitting with the King of glory with filthy feet
 - c. Nobody is thinking about serving the others
 - d. Except the Master
 - i. The LAST one who should be serving
 - ii. Humbles Himself

iv. Intentionality

- 1. He stood up
- 2. Took a towel
- 3. Wrapped it around Himself

v. Humility

- 1. He would have to kneel before them
 - a. Imagine room suddenly going quiet
 - b. They are ashamed
 - c. They are embarrassed for Jesus
 - d. What is He doing!?

- 2. These guys didn't deserve this!
- 3. But that's the whole point
 - a. Maybe Jesus could kneel and wash the clean feet of royalty
 - b. MAYBE
 - c. But to wash the dirty feet of proud and sinful fishermen?!?
- 4. They wouldn't do this for Him, let alone each other!
 - a. And here He was, the greatest among men, humbling himself
 - b. What short memories they had!
 - c. Earlier in the week Jesus had taught them that the greatest among them must be their servant
 - d. They forgot, like we do
 - e. So, He shows them what it looks like
 - f. He intentionally, and humbly sacrifices

vi. Sacrifice

- 1. Dirt on himself
- 2. Like Jesus on a Sunday morning at FBCW shoveling the walks

b. Disbelief: Peter thought He knew better than Jesus

- i. "6 Then cometh he to Simon Peter: and Peter saith unto him, Lord, dost thou wash my feet?"
- ii. This blew the minds of the disciples
 - 1. Peter "This cannot be happening Lord!"
 - 2. What are you doing?
 - a. He must have been ashamed
 - b. Shocked, Mortified
 - i. He had confessed Him as the source of truth
 - ii. As Christ, son of the living God
 - iii. And this God-man was kneeling before him!
 - iv. Declaring him clean!
 - v. What a privilege for Peter...And it horrified him
- iii. Why would you do this, Lord?

c. Doctrine: Jesus had some lessons for His disciples

- i. #1 I am your Master and Lord
 - 1. "12 So after he had washed their feet, and had taken his garments, and was set down again, he said unto them, Know ye what I have done to you? 13 Ye call me Master and Lord: and ye say well; for so I am."
 - 2. Jesus: "Do you understand the significance, here?"
 - a. I am your Master, your Rabbi, teacher
 - b. I am your Lord, owner

- c. This activity (washing feet) is closer to you than to me
- d. Deuteronomy 30:11-14
 - i. It's not too hard to understand
 - ii. It's not too far off for you
 - iii. So, do it!
- e. If your Master and Lord can do it, so can you...
- ii. #2 You should wash each other's feet as I have done for you
 - 1. 14 If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet. 15 For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you."
 - 2. What was Jesus saying?
 - 3. Love like this!
 - a. Not just washing feet
 - i. This is symbolic for all kinds of acts of selfless love
 - ii. This is an example
 - iii. This is how you display agape love for the world
 - b. John 13:35 "By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another."
 - i. By what? By love!
 - ii. Christianity on display
- iii. #3 Happiness is found in doing what you know Jesus commands
 - 1. "16 Verily, verily, I say unto you, The servant is not greater than his lord; neither he that is sent greater than he that sent him. 17 If (since) ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them."
 - 2. Want to be blessed?
 - 3. Love like Jesus
 - a. Humbly
 - b. Sacrificially
 - c. 1 Peter 5:5 "...be clothed with humility."
 - 4. Why?
 - a. The world will tell you that happiness is in pride
 - b. But Jesus will tell you: true happiness is in self-denial
 - c. Happiness is in not found in getting things your way
 - d. Jesus says, happiness is in doing things MY way with love
 - e. A couple of bonus benefits too:
 - i. You will know you are saved! 1 John 3:18-19
 - ii. The world will know you are saved John 13:35
