Following Jesus Remember Me

Luke 22:14-20(21-23), Matthew 26:20-25

I. The Past: Passover (v. 14-15/Exodus) "And when the hour was come, he sat down, and the twelve apostles with him. And he said unto them, With desire I have desired to eat this passover with you before I suffer:"

A. Observe

- 1. God revealed himself more completely to Moses than anyone!
- 2. He revealed his name
- 3. He revealed his power
- 4. The children of Israel had an opportunity to see what God was doing first hand in Israel

B. Trust

- 1. The Passover is arguably the single most important event in the history of the Nation of Israel because:
 - a) It demonstrated the right attitude
 - b) It demonstrated obedience
 - c) It demonstrated God's power to save
- 2. The Jewish culture of Jesus' day was right to make a big deal about the Passover
- 3. Think about the attitude of trust demonstrated
 - a) God had displayed his power
 - b) But this was the first time some action was required

C. Obey

- 1. Think about the obedience necessary Wipe Blood all over the place
- 2. While the Israelites had seen the plagues, so had the Egyptians
- 3. This required trust and obedience
- 4. This resulted in salvation!
- 5. Not just of life (firstborns) but of the entire nation (exodus)
- II. The Present: Jesus and his Sacrifice (v 19-20) "And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and said, Take this, and divide it among yourselves: for I say unto you, I will not drink of the fruit of the vine, until the kingdom of God shall come."

A. The Meal

- 1. The Passover Meal was a highly regulated meal with specific practices commanded by God and added to by later Jewish tradition (Exodus 12, 23, Leviticus 23)
- 2. At the end of the meal a young person would ritually ask "What makes this night special"
- 3. A teacher or a wiser individual would recount the Exodus

B. Picture

- 1. The original Passover was a clear picture of what God would accomplish through Jesus
- 2. Jesus then uses the Passover feast to picture specifically what would happen
- C. Body "And he took bread, and gave thanks, and brake it, and gave unto them...
 - 1. Jesus was fully man, fully God Philippians 2:6-7
 - 2. Jesus lived a sinless life Hebrews 4:15
 - 3. Jesus physically died for our sin, paying the punishment Romans 5:8-9
 - 4. Jesus physically rose again I Corinthians 15:3-4
 - 5. This is my body which is given for you: this do in remembrance of me."
- D. Blood "Likewise also the cup after supper..."
 - 1. Jesus shed his innocent blood for us Romans 5:9; I Peter 1:19 ;Ephesians 1:7
 - 2. We are declared both innocent and heirs of Jesus by his blood Revelation 1:5-6
 - 3. We are saved from death and saved to a relationship with God Romans 8:31-32
 - 4. "This cup is the new testament in my blood, which is shed for you."

III. The Future: Communion (v 16-18/I Corinthians)

A. Remember

- 1. Luke and Paul make it clear that we, as Christians, are to regularly do what Jesus did
- 2. The entire point was remember Jesus

B. Reunion

- 1. Paul clearly viewed community as part of this I Corinthians 11:33
- 2. Paul commands the church of Corinth to gather and do this correctly
