Following Jesus From Denial to Difference-maker <u>Luke 22</u>, Acts, 1 Peter

- I. Peter, an example of the difference Jesus can make in a life
 - a. Iesus knew Peter would fold like a house of cards when things got really scary
 - i. He wasn't fully prepared for what was to come
 - ii. In the garden, he wasn't even able to pray
 - iii. Kept falling asleep with the others
 - b. This was the guy who boldly proclaimed his readiness a few hours earlier
 - i. Luke 22:33-34
 - ii. But Jesus knew something else about Peter
 - iii. Though a denier of Jesus, through the power of the Holy Spirit, he would become a real difference-maker!
 - iv. Luke 22:31-34
 - 1. He WAS converted
 - 2. Fully turned back to Christ and committed
 - 3. "From Denier to Difference-maker" (How possible?)
 - 4. Read Luke 22:54-62
 - c. There is surprising irony in Peter's life and influence on the church
 - i. He is the original apostle of boldness in the face of death
 - 1. Acts 2:22-23
 - 2. Acts 4:1-20
 - 3. Acts 5:25-32
 - ii. But he is also the apostle of fearlessness in his letters
 - d. What happened after his denial that changed him?
 - i. First, the resurrection of Jesus
 - 1. Acts 5:30-31
 - 2. Acts 10:40-43
 - ii. Second, the indwelling of the Holy Spirit
- II. Message (lessons Peter apparently learned as a committed follower of Jesus)
 - a. Satan loves to take down followers of Jesus 1 Peter 5:8-11
 - i. You need to be perfected, established, strengthened, and settled v.10
 - ii. You need to be aware of your own spiritual vulnerability!
 - iii. You need some sobriety and vigilance in your life! v.8
 - b. (If we do fail) God is a God of merciful forgiveness 1 Peter 2:9-10
 - i. Peter utterly failed
 - ii. Satan totally sifted him!
 - iii. He denied Christ publicly!
 - 1. But he learned see himself differently in Christ b/c of God's mercy

- 2. Notice how he describes forgiven believers in this passage:
- 3. He focuses on the fact that all followers of God are special!
 - a. They have obtained mercy!
 - b. They no longer walk in darkness
 - c. Welcome to the light!
 - d. You don't need to be defined by your failure

c. The followers of Jesus do not need to fear boldly associating with Christ!

- 1 Peter 3:13-17
 - i. You can actually be "happy" in the face of suffering for Jesus v.14
 - ii. But you need to be ready to give an answer v.15
 - iii. "Don't be afraid of their terror, neither be troubled!" v14
 - 1. You don't need to panic
 - 2. Get your answer (your testimony) ready
 - 3. Live above reproach
 - 4. Find happiness in associating with Jesus

d. Suffering for Christ is suffering with Christ and glorifies God! – 1 Peter

4:12-16

- i. Suffering for Christ will result in eternal joy v.13
- ii. Suffering for Christ brings the spirit of God upon you v.14
- iii. Suffering for Christ brings glory to God v.16

e. Remember God is faithful in your suffering for Jesus' name – 1 Peter 4:19

- i. Peter was in self-preservation mode at the arrest of Jesus
- ii. I'VE got to do something to keep me safe!
 - 1. He learned to commit the keeping of his soul to His faithful Creator
 - 2. We don't have to preserve ourselves
 - 3. God is faithful and will "keep your soul"

III. Conclusions

- a. Be aware of Satan's plans to take down Jesus' followers
- b. Be ready to speak up, associate with, and suffer for Jesus' name
- c. Be focused on the power of the Jesus' resurrection
