## Following Jesus Mission Accomplished John 19:28-30

- I. The wrath and love of God displayed on the Cross
  - A. Roman Crucifixion
    - 1. Shock and Awe
    - 2. Don't mess with Rome
    - 3. Roman Crucifixion
      - a) Crucifixion was the most horrible tool in the Roman arsenal
      - b) Roman leaders would beat criminals, but usually would allow their wounds to heal
      - c) Crucifixion killed in a number of ways
        - (1) Asphyxiation
        - (2) Loss of Blood
        - (3) Exposure
        - (4) Thirst
    - 4. Jesus' Crucifixion
      - a) Jesus was not given a time to rest, shortening (but not making easier) his death Matthew 27:26
      - b) Jesus was forced to carry his crossbar, but was too weak to complete this task Mark 15:21
      - c) Crucifixion was public, so the crime was attached to the cross
        - (1) "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews."
        - (2) John 19:19b
  - B. Jesus' Followers
    - 1. The Disciples
      - a) The Gospels describe several disciples near the cross, the source of our eye-witness testimony Luke 23:27; John 19:25-26a
      - b) Many women were present, but the only one of the twelve we can be confident in is John the Apostle
    - 2. The Women
      - a) Four women are identified
        - (1) Jesus' Mother
        - (2) Mary's Sister (possible Salome, John and James Mom)
        - (3) Mary the wife of Cleopas
        - (4) Mary Magdalene

- C. Jesus' Love (even in trial)
  - 1. Care for Sinners
    - a) While not the main thrust of our passage, note Jesus love during this worst of trials
    - b) Jesus is willing to forgive even those who afflicted him with the worst of punishments and mocked him Luke 23:34a
  - 2. Care for his Mother
    - a) Jesus is even thinking of his mother John 19:26-27
    - b) Jesus' care here is mirrored in I Timothy 5 1 Timothy 5:4
    - c) Jesus has prioritized others even in his need
- II. The Mission of Jesus was completed on the cross
  - A. The Savior's Identity
    - 1. God
      - a) Jesus had to be 100% God
        - (1) Only God could be perfect Hebrews 4:14b-15
        - (2) Only God could pay for all sin Romans 8:3-4
    - 2. Man
      - a) Jesus had to be 100% Man
        - (1) Only man could pay for sin Romans 5:15
        - (2) Only man could stand in our place Romans 5:17
  - B. The Savior's Suffering
    - 1. Jesus suffered
      - a) Jesus endured human pain or us Isaiah 53:4-5
      - b) Jesus endured being cut off from God for us Matthew 27:46 b
    - 2. Jesus died
      - a) The Penalty for Sin is Death Romans 6:23
      - b) Someone has to die for our sin Romans 6:7
  - C. The Savior's Completed Mission
    - 1. Substitutionary Death
      - a) Jesus lived to die
      - b) Jesus died so we can live
        - (a) Romans 6:8
        - (2) 1 Peter 2:24
      - c) Jesus exchanged his place for ours II Corinthians 5:21
    - 2. Salvation For All
      - a) What Jesus did was effective for all Hebrews 9:26
      - b) Jesus paid for every sin I John 2:2

- 3. Salvation Was Completed
  - a) There is nothing you need to/can do
  - b) You can believe that its completed Romans 10:9
  - c) All you need to do is put your faith in Jesus

  - B. Salvation Provides Power Matthew 28:19-20
